### From the Vollunteer Opportunities Co-Chairs . . .

Do you love international cultural exchanges? The Volunteer Opportunities Co-chairs Brigid Edmonds and Peg Walter do. Both women are seeking additional adult volunteers to help them tutor refugee adults and children. Several Notre Dame students are already committed to help. The current program takes place at Park Jefferson Apartments Community Room at 3001 E Jefferson Blvd., South Bend, from 3:30-5:00 PM on Thursdays. The first session was September 4, 2014. As a volunteer, you will spend time one-on-one with a refugee each week, teaching conversational English. You do NOT need to know Arabic (or any other foreign language). However, there is wireless connectivity, so if you have a laptop, bring it as Google Translate is useful.

The refugees are mostly from Iraq, though some are from other Arab or African countries. Each year the South Bend community absorbs 75 new refugees, who are legal immigrants approved by the US State Department. These refugees have chosen South Bend, IN, as their new home. Currently, 11 refugees are in need of tutors at this location. The program is in its second year. If need be, the program is able to expand to other refugees and/or other days. Depending on their circumstances, the ND students may need transportation to Park Jefferson. 


and continues to do so this year. Contact her as chair for any information concerning this group as well as obtaining directions to members' homes.




women's rights movements, wound around the intriguing narrative of a young slave, Hetty, who was given to Sarah as an 11th birthday present."

### IN MEMORIAM

Lieselotte Ella Biswas February 14, 1920 - March 28, 2014



"She was a women of adventure ...."

Longtime Ladies of Notre Dame & Saint Mary's College member Lilo Biswas was born on February 14, 1920, in Kassel, Germany, to the late Walter and Luisa Thiel. Known throughout her life as Lilo, she worked as both a nurse and as a kindergarten teacher. After meeting and marrying her husband, Nripendra Biswas, Lilo moved with him to the United States, settling in South Bend, IN. For many years Nripen, as he was known, was a Professor of Physics at Notre Dame.

While her beloved husband taught, Lilo was very busy with assorted activities. Calling on her background as a kindergarten teacher, Lilo opened her own nursery school, *The Cosmopolitan Playschool*. She was also an involved member of both LND/SMC and the South Bend Garden Club. Lilo and Nripen together raised two children, Arun and Indira. After Nripen died and when Lilo's health began to fail, she moved from South Bend to Columbus, Ohio, to be near her son and his family.

At the age of 94, following a long battle with Alzheimer's Disease, Lilo died in Westerville, Ohio, on March 28, 2014. A celebration of Lilo's life was held at Palmer Funeral Home Hickey Chapel, 17131 Cleveland Road, South Bend, on June 24, 2014. Later, a private internment took place at Cedar Grove Cemetery, Notre Dame, Indiana.

# Notre Dame Forum on Women Leadership in the Church April 4, 2014

Prior to attending the *ND Forum on Women Leadership in the Church* on April 4, 2014, ten women from the Ladies met for dinner at Legends. In his opening remarks at the Forum, Fr. John Jenkins, csc, stated: "Pope Francis has spoken on a number of occasions about the distinctive role of women in the life of the Church in various forms of witness, ministry and leadership." Yet Pope Francis has not envisioned the ordination of women but has called for further study on women's role in the Church, especially "in the exercise of authority."

Once the questions of ordination were removed

from the discussion, the panel presented interesting observations as well as suggestions of where women might have more meaningful roles in the church. Fr. Matt Malone, SJ, editor-in-chief of *America*, stated that Mary Magdalene was the

first person to recognize the risen Christ. He pondered how did women loose this "first spot" of ministry? He asked: "Why can't a laywomen be a Papal ambassador? A managerial head of a diocese? Or head of a Curia department in Rome? Or President of a Jesuit University? Do such positions require ordination?" He sees no reason why "every other office that doesn't require ordination

employ women."

Anne Thompson, the moderator, asked: "Will there be a Clare to accompany this Francis?"\*\* Ann Selak, lay minister and rector of Walsh Hall, observes that young Catholic women in the Western world see where she can be a leader in the secular world but not in her church. Re-thinking such leadership possibilities will not only change the lives of lay women but also the lives of lay men.

Kathleen Sprows Cummings, director of the Cushwa Center for the Study of American Catholicism at ND, stated "women can, and do, ex-

> ercise leadership in their own parishes. They need not wait for this change to start in Vatican City." It was observed that when women's energies and talents are not welcomed in the Catholic Church, many tend to distance themselves

from the church as well as from their faith. Following the panel's discussion the audience was invited to ask questions of the panel. \*\*[One of the first followers of Francis of Assisi, Clare founded a monastic religious order for women in the Franciscan tradition and wrote the first monastic rule known to be written by a woman and served as an abbess. Unlike a prioress, an abbess does not require an ordained minister to oversee her.]
