
MORNING LITERATURE

SUMMARY OF MINUTES FROM BOARD MEETING

10/23/2012

The Board met at the Harris Branch Library on October 23, 2012. After approving the prior meeting's minutes and the Treasurer's Report, the board received updates on upcoming program events, ideas for some additional newcomers/visitors events and some of the playgroup's activities. 
The Board also discussed the Opening Reception. During that evening 33 newcomer's folders were handed out. As of mid-October ,10 newcomers have signed up to join the Ladies and paid their dues. Pam Chipman updated the board on current membership numbers. As of October 16,2012, there are 135 Life Members, 10 New Members and 94 Renewing Members.

Fundraising for our scholarships at Notre Dame and Saint Mary's was one of the main topics of conversation. The Board reviewed the results from the survey that was e-mailed to all members on September 25, 2012. Linnea Lannon shared the results. Board members received a summary of a discussion that Mary Lou Derwent had with the Hammes Bookstore assistant manager regarding some concerns the Board had after last year's event. It was also brought to the Board's attention that at this time there is no chairperson for this event and we are already behind the planning timeline. RESULT OF SURVEY OF MEMBERSHIP ON SCHOLARSHIP FUND-RAISING AND SUBSEQUENT ACTION BY THE BOARD

Thank you to the 61 LND/SMC members who took the time to complete the survey about our scholarship fund-raising efforts. When the board members met October 23, 2012, they reviewed the data and took your suggestions into careful consideration. They also discussed information from the Hammes Bookstore staff and past scholarship chairpersons.

First, we noted that our members continue to be very generous in their personal donations to the scholarship funds for Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College, (p. 13) and according to the survey, you want us to continue with that effort.

We will also continue making Remembrance and Celebration cards available since our members find them useful and plan to use them in the future. If you do not know about the Remembrance and Celebration cards, read more about them in a separate article (p. 9) in this newsletter. ND alums may be interested to know that money contributed through the cards count towards their annual contributions to be entered in the football ticket lottery!

Finally, 52% of the survey respondents want fundraising, in addition to the personal donations and Remembrance and Celebration cards, to continue. However, 76% of you said you would be unlikely to work at the Bookstore fundraiser in the future. We also do not have a chairperson for the event, and we are behind our commitment dates. So, to meet the call for fundraising, we discussed alternatives, including suggestions put forth by survey respondents.

At this time, the board has decided to pursue a different fundraising opportunity that the Bookstore has offered LND/SMC. Mary Lou Derwent is organizing people to wrap gifts that people purchase at the Bookstore (p. 13). This event will not require as much work from the chairperson, but we will need volunteers to spend several hours wrapping gifts. We will share more details as we work with the Bookstore to arrange the gift wrapping, and we will soon ask you to help wrap presents, perhaps for college students doing their Christmas shopping or families buying graduation gifts. Consider donating a few hours that you can spend with friends. Let this be one on the ways to contribute to the scholarship fund and the local women who benefit. Meredith Mersits, from Saint Mary's, recently wrote that she truly appreciates the work we do to provide her with a scholarship. The scholarship is helping her as she pursues a nursing degree and her dreams to be a traveling nurse. Let's help women like Meredith again this year.



From the VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES CHAIR . . .

The Christ Child Society of South Bend is a non-profit organization of volunteers dedicated to the personal service and clothing needs of all children in the area. The South Bend chapter has been providing service to children for 61 years and currently has over 500 volunteers. Services provided by the Christ Child Society include: layettes, winter clothing for children, "My Stuff" bags, tutoring/mentoring and the Christmas gift program.

The Christ Child Society currently is looking for volunteers for their tutoring program at St. Adalbert School. The tutoring program matches volunteers with a particular teacher. The teacher chooses the student(s) with whom the tutor works. There may be one child per session or several who each get a portion of the allotted time. Tutors are asked to commit to one hour per week through May (allowing for holidays, etc). The teacher will provide the work for the student. Tutors do not have to prepare anything. It is often reading with the student, quizzing vocab words or math flash cards, helping pull important information from a text, etc.

Handouts are provided with background information on working with children from non-English speaking backgrounds (most of the children come from Spanish speaking homes). Aids for 'teaching' vocabulary and reading comprehension are also provided to help with the tutoring process.

Tutors are currently needed for PreK, 1st grade, and middle school. Tutors for other grade levels may be needed as teachers evaluate the needs of students as the school year progresses. There are times/ days that teachers have suggested that allow for students to leave the classroom without missing crucial classroom instruction. We work around the teachers' schedules and tutor availability.



Rita M. Bottei

August 13, 1933 - September 10, 2012



Rita Bottei passed away at the Kindred Transitional Care and Rehabilitation in South Bend, IN on September 10, 2012. She was born on August 13, 1933, to the late Mathew E. and Bernice (Rutkowski) Uznanski in Chicago, IL. Her one brother, Kenneth M. Uznanski also preceded her in death.

Rita received a Bachelor Degree from Rosary College (currently Dominican University) of River Forrest, IL. She then went on to receive her Master's Degree and PhD from the University of Illinois in Champagne, IL. She later received a Master's of Science in Administration degree from the University of Notre Dame in the 1980s. She was a professor of chemistry at St. Ambrose College in Davenport, IA, Saint Mary's College at Notre Dame, IN, and Indiana University of South Bend, IN.

A member of Christ the King Parish, she served as Secretary of the Potawatomi Kiwanis Club and as the Past President of the Women's Art League, Past President of University Civitan and was a longtime volunteer for the Senior Health Insurance Information Program (S.H.I.P.).

On August 13, 1960, Rota married Rudolph S.(Rudy) Bottei in Chicago, IL. He was a professor of Chemistry at the University of Notre Dame. He died on April 23, 2003. She is survived by her daughter, Roberta A. Bottei of South Bend, and three sons, Gregory M. Bottei, M.D. of Green Bay, WI; Paul R. (Theresa) Bottei of Nashville, TN, Edward M. (Deana) Bottei M.D., of Sioux City, IA., five grandchildren and one step-granddaughter as well as a sister-in-law, Joan Uznanski of St. Paul, MN.

solve the problem of raising funds for its annual Scholarships. The Board has come to an agreement with the Hammes Bookstore that it would provide a service to the Bookstore by staffing a table for gift-wrapping during the days of high sales for gifts; namely, Black Friday, Christmas, Junior Parent Weekend and Graduation.


