From the President . . .

In the fall of 1972, I was in the first class of women to matriculate at Notre Dame We had some very unique experiences as the university,

faculty and male students adjusted to having women live on campus. We were scored "beauty pageant style" on many nights as we walked through the South Dining Hall. We were constantly asked to give the female point of view in many of our classes. Physical education classes were especially challenging to

the male PE faculty. A few of my non-swimmer friends mysteriously passed the mandatory swimming test without swimming a stroke. Two male dorms were converted for the women by installing washing machines and dryers and boarding up the urinals.

It was an exciting time for us, for everyone. The iconic image of co-education at Notre Dame was the banner hanging over the South Dining Hall, "We're Glad You're Here." It represented the warm welcome we received as female students. We immediately felt a part of the Notre Dame community. We believed our presence was wanted and vital to the future of the university.

Now as I serve as President of the Ladies of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College, I see this community from the inside. There are so many rich and rewarding opportunities available—classes, lectures, concerts, plays and even, football! Our organization exists to help faculty spouses and families feel welcomed and



engaged with the Notre Dame and Saint Mary's






"Off the Beaten Path" Notre Dame, IN



The first exception to the third Monday will be Monday, September 9, 2013, when Sue Uhran will lead the discussion of Jan-Philipp Sendker's




so that you can participate in the discussion, but, if you wish to come and listen, you are welcome.

Summary Report of Ladies of Notre Dame & Saint Mary's College Annual Business Meeting April 24, 2013 7:00 PM EDT

Prior to the LND/SMC Annual Business meeting, April 24, 2013, Charles Powell, a staff member at Innovation Park (IP), gave those in attendance a tour of the facility. The tour started in the Judd Leighton Board Room, named for the principal donor for the building. The Board Room is one of the more professional rooms in the building. It is a place where start-up companies can meet with interested business partners and be confident that potential partners see that the start-up is doing something right. Every technological resource for communication is present. The entire building is secure and adaptable to various experimental

operations.

The consulting staff for IP is drawn from research professionals at Saint Mary's College, the University of Notre Dame and the IU Medical School in South Bend. While at IP the goal for the companies is to accelerate research into product production, hopefully in 3-5 years. It was stated that no one has been pushed out but the focus is for businesses to grow sufficiently large so that they can leave. There is help within IP for this to happen.

The company *F Cubed* developed a "lab-on-a-chip" that is now used to target infectious particles in food products and drinking water. Testing, with results, can be done within an hour. The company has moved to the old convent space at the old St. Joseph High School. Another company *Data Realty* has moved out to a facility in Ignition Park in South Bend. It has developed a model for mid-sized companies to manage the storage, security and analysis of their own data.

In the three years of its existence, 6 or 7 businesses have left IP, and moved-on due to their increasing business. During this period, 45-50 clients have been served. There is room for expansion on the 12-acre lot and hopefully more building will be planned. The IP facility and land is owned by the University.

Overall, IP is a very creative and impressive place

to visit. Powell pointed out that throughout the building are crucifixes that are made from tin by

native Haitian artists.

Everywhere you look in this building there is something to catch your eye. It is



a stimulating environment. The building is creatively complimented with words, such as STAY FOCUSED, and objects, especially the clocks! ... Visit sometime ... at least stop in the lobby and look around.

When eleven women entered Vite Greenhouse on April 16, 2013, to meet with Jerome Vite for a talk, they were met by a gorgeous array of colorful flowers waiting to be planted in their gardens and pots. Jerome related that his family were farmers. His Dad built the greenhouse in order to start musk melon seeds, so that he could be "first to the market with his melons!" Prior to 1980, the Vites only grew vegetables. In the early 80's, his parents started growing flowers as well and it was at this time that his sons decided to return home and become part of the business.

Throughout his talk Jerome Vite discussed relatively new plants called "Proven Winners." These are flowers and vegetables that are grown from cuttings, not seeds. The plants are sterile and "do not set seeds," thus more "plant energy is put into the plant and its flower/vegetables." All in attendance went home with literature providing ideas for group plantings, landscaping, developing beds and pots for both veg-

Mary Holmes Bernard September 2, 1923 - July 1, 2013

#

"She pursued life with courage ...

By any measure, Mollie Bernard's life was full of accomplishments. Born Mary Holmes in London, Ontario, Mollie was a woman of strong faith, courage and an intense interest in education. In 1944, in Washington D.C., she met and later wed U.S. Navy Commander Leon Bernard. Their married life took them from Washington, DC, to Chapel Hill, NC, and then to South Bend, IN, where, in 1950, Leon accepted a position teaching European History at the University of Notre Dame

Once settled in South Bend, Mollie set about establishing a private school where local children could receive a superior education. Originally called the Mary Reid Cleland School, it remains in existence today, 55 years later, as Stanley Clark School. Mollie served as headmistress of the school for five years.

After resigning as head of Cleland School, Mollie became involved in a number of other activities. Among them were The Ladies of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College, the Christ Child Society and the St. Ann's Society. After receiving a Master of Arts in Theology at Notre Dame, Mollie became Director of Religious Education at Sacred Heart Parish, Notre Dame, IN. She held that position for sixteen years.

Mollie's full life was not without its sorrow and tragedy. Mollie and Leon lost three children in separate incidents. They were aged 2, 7 and 9, respectively, when they passed away. Then in the mid-1960s, Leon was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. Until his death in 1989, the wheel-chair bound Professor Bernard was a familiar sight around the Notre Dame campus.

Mollie died on July 1, 2013, leaving behind a large and loving family of seven daughters, thirty grandchildren and seventeen great-grandchildren. Her funeral Mass on July 5, 2013, was held at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame, IN. She was buried in Cedar Grove Cemetery next to her beloved Leon and their three deceased children.

Born in Cincinnati, OH, on February 22, 1927, Mary Patricia was the only child of William and Alice Burns. Her lifetime love of learning earned her many degrees, beginning with a B.A. in English and Philosophy from the College of Mount Saint Joseph in 1948. Following this degree, Pat went on to receive an M.A. in Philosophy (Catholic University of America), a Fulbright grant in Psychology (Institute de Psychologie, Université Paris), and a Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology (University of Chicago).

Upon completing her formal education, Pat served an internship in Clinical Psychology at Rush-Presbyterian-Saint Luke's Medical Center in Chicago, followed by a residency in Clinical Psychology at the University of Notre Dame.

During her lengthy and impressive professional career, Pat served a number of institutions in a variety of capacities. Among them were the South Bend Clinic, the South Bend Community School Corporation, the University of Notre Dame, Saint Joseph Regional Medical Center and the Roman Catholic Marriage Tribunal. She was especially interested in the intersection of psychology and philosophy, particularly as they informed the clinical practice of child psychology and personality development.

In addition to her rich professional life, Pat and her husband, Notre Dame Professor of Humanities Frederick J. Crosson, who predeceased her, raised five children. In time, the family grew to include five grandchildren.

Pat died on July 28, 2013 after a long illness. Her funeral was celebrated at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame, IN on August 5, 2013, with burial in Cedar Grove Cemetery, Notre Dame, IN following the service.


