## Trip to INDIANA DUNES NATIONAL LAKESHORE

The *Outdoor Adventures* Interest Group traveled to Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore near Chesterton, Indiana on Friday, October 7, for a wonderful autumn day at the Dunes.

We carpooled from South Bend to the Visitor Center of the park where we gathered for a video presentation about the cultural and natural features of the area. We learned that Congress established the park in 1966 to protect the land from further industrial development and to study the



unique biological communities of the area. The National Lakeshore stretches along 15 miles of the southern shore of Lake Michigan.

We explored

the West Beach area and hiked the Dune Succession Trail which included a climb up 250 stairs for a spectacular view of Lake Michigan and Chicago.

After lunch at a covered picnic area, we returned to South Bend, arriving home around 3:00 p.m. The group highly recommends a day trip to all of you who have not yet visited Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore. In fact, our group will probably return to explore another hiking area.

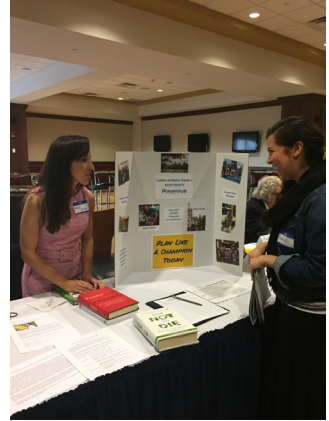




# OPENING RECEPTION

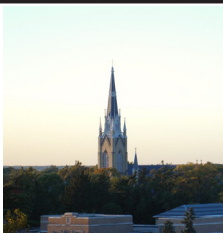

IN MEMORIAM

Julia A. Lupresto Kempf

September 7, 1924 - September 4, 2016



Julia was born in South Bend, Indiana, to the late Pasquale and Josephine Lupresto. She was educated at St. Joseph Grade School and Central High School, graduating from that institution in 1942.

In 1945 she met a young Notre Dame student, Kenneth R. Kempf, from Blue Island, Illinois. Ken had completed his military service then came to Notre Dame to earn his engineering degree. Julia and Ken were married in St. Joseph Church on April 30, 1949.

Julia was a devoted wife and mother as well as an avid gardener and quilter, baker and seamstress. One particular joy was baking German anise cookies each holiday season for distribution to family and friends. The family recipe, once lost, was found and perfected by Julia. Relatives promise this lovely tradition will continue.

She was also a lifelong volunteer, serving organizations including St. Joseph Hospital, Christ Child Society, Senior Life, Bethany Society and Funeral Ministry of Sacred Heart Parish, Notre Dame, and our own Ladies of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College.

Julia's dear husband Ken died in 1979. She was also predeceased by two brothers, Rocco and James Lupresto. Survivors include a son Paul (Martha) Kempf of South Bend and three grandchildren, Andrew, Allyson and Adam Kempf, as well as a sister, Rose M. Brzezinski and a brother, Joseph Lupresto.

The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame, Indiana, on September 8, 2016. Burial followed at Cedar Grove Cemetery, Notre Dame.
