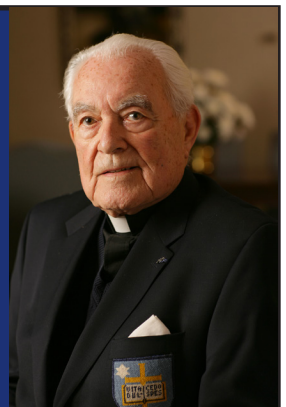

PLANT-BASED EATING GROUP

Transitioning to a whole-foods plant-based diet is vitally important for our own health because the standard American diet high on processed foods and animal products has been shown to cause the chronic diseases of the west – cardiovascular disease, diabetes, hypertension and cancer are among the most devastating. Incorporating more fresh fruit, veggies and whole grains is shown to prevent, treat and reverse these diseases in scientific studies. Aside from our own health, we also know that animal agriculture is ecologically damaging, and that it imposes a great deal of suffering on animals. To leave a viable planet for children and to advance the value of compassion, we are interested in shifting from a diet heavy on animal foods to one centered around whole plants.

Eating in this new way is quite a change for many of us, and we have lots of questions and can benefit from the support of others. We rely on evidence, explore new studies, learn from each other and support each other. The Plant-Based Eating Group is an easy, friendly and nonjudgmental space to explore plant-based eating!

Each session will begin with a discussion of substantive topics and end with sampling some plant-based foods! Meetings are at my home, 50900 Ashford Lane, Granger at 2:30 PM on Wednesdays.

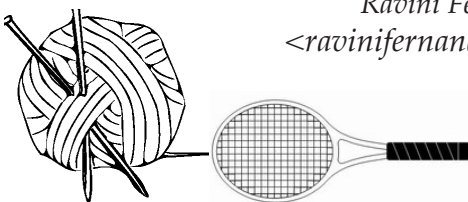

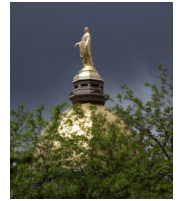

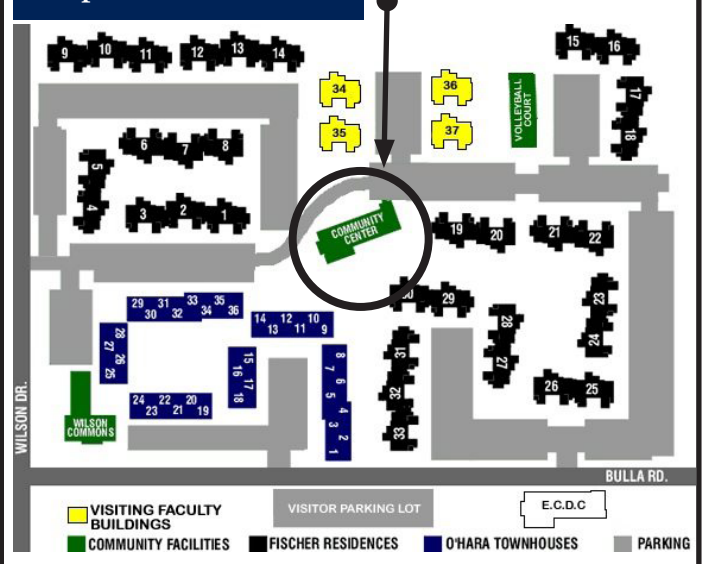

Elizabeth “Liz” Cullity

February 14, 1923 - June 28, 2017



Liz was born in Sheridan, Indiana, to the late Donald K. and Elsie (King) Kercheval. On January 30, 1963, in Sacred Heart Church, Notre Dame, Indiana (now Sacred Heart Basilica), she married Professor Bernard D. Cullity. Professor Cullity taught in Notre Dame’s School of Engineering from 1950 until his death in 1978.

Liz loved the arts. For ten years she was a music teacher in the South Bend Community School Corporation. Following that she became Manager of the South Bend Symphony, a position she held for 26 years until her retirement in 1986. Post-retirement she remained active and involved in the South Bend Symphony as board member then board member emeritus.

A longtime member of Sacred Heart Parish, Notre Dame, Liz also loved to travel, visiting many countries during her trips abroad.

Liz was predeceased by her parents, her husband Bernard, a sister, Georgiannah Wellington, and her brother, Donald M. Kercheval.

Liz is survived by a sister, Mariea DeVera, as well as three nieces and one nephew.

A Mass of Christian Burial was held in Sacred Heart Basilica, on the campus of Notre Dame, on July 3, 2017. Burial next to her husband in Cedar Grove Cemetery, Notre Dame, IN, followed the Mass.

August 26, 1924 - April 20, 2017



Lydia was born in Beijing, China, to the late General Shen Chun Chi and Thang Lu Yun. She married Lawrence H.N. Lee on December 18, 1948. Lydia loved to accompany her husband, a professor in Notre Dame’s Engineering School from 1950-1993, as he traveled to other countries to attend conferences and present his professional papers.

Lydia was a beloved teacher at Swanson Elementary School in South Bend for over twenty years. She was a superb cook and a welcoming hostess, especially on Notre Dame home football weekends. Legendary pre-game brunches featured her famous egg rolls. Lydia was also an artist and regular tennis player. During 1967-68, she was president of our very own organization.

Lydia was predeceased by her parents, her husband Lawrence, who died in 2007, as well as by her daughter, Nora M. Lee, and her brother, Peter Shen.

Lydia is survived by her son Lynn L. “Max” Lee, three grandchildren, Christopher L. Lee (Abby), Lauren E. Lee McCormick (Nate) and Abigail M. Lee. Also surviving are four great-grandchildren and Lydia’s sister, Florence Shen.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart on the Notre Dame campus on May 5, 2017. Burial followed in Cedar Grove Cemetery, Notre Dame, IN.
