Speaker Series - Missy Conboy, Senior Deputy Director of Athletics, Notre Dame

A very attentive group of women recently gathered in a renovated conference room in the Joyce Center to meet Missy Conboy, ND '82, the Senior Deputy Director of Athletics at Notre Dame, currently under Director Jack Swarbrick.

After receiving a law degree from Kansas University, Conboy went to work for the NCAA

as a violation investigator / prosecutor in both men's and women's sports. When she accepted Notre Dame's offer as a compliance officer for the Athletic Catherine Kossler, LND/ Department she arrived on the same day that the new Athletic Director, Dick Rosenthal, took of-

fice. Since her days as a student athlete (1978-82, captain '82) on the Notre Dame Women's Basketball team to today, Conboy has seen the rapid growth and flourishing of not only women's athletics but all athletics at Notre Dame. From the beginning, while responsible for all athletes, not just women, her focus was on basketball, volleyball and tennis. She was interested in gender equity. In 1988 there were only 27 athletic scholarships for women. At that time, the ratio of men to women at the university was 2:1. Today it is close to 1:1.

Subsequent athletic directors increased the number of women's scholarships and provided leadership in hiring better coaches. The philosophy of the department encouraged coaches to be teachers as well as coaches, as athletes had to have good role models. In all Division I sports, scholarships were to be fully funded. Student athletes are looking for education and facilities that are "more than adequate." On 09/11/01, a master plan for \$128 million was implemented... facilities fitting architecturally with the University style as well as serviceable to the department. Conboy was involved with all of the work on this plan.... thus adding "construction and facilities management" to her title. Her latest additional project was the athletic part of the Crossroads Project. She is excited that "the stadium that Rockne built" is "the part of the university where athletics were incorporated with the academic and social campus community."

As a wife and a mother of 3 daughters, Conboy has an active life. She is settled in the local community, unlike her youth when as a daughter in a military family she attended 12 schools in 13 years!

What is her future? She still oversees policy compliance issues as deputy Title 9 officer for athletics at Notre Dame and as a member of a legal team for the NCAA. She is part of the university's discussion on possible additional sports for both men and women, perhaps "women's ice hockey!" In closing, she answered questions from the audience.

Perhaps in the future, Notre Dame will have a new athletic director, and HER name will be Conboy. She is more than qualified.

In Memoriam

Patricia Carroll Weber

February 1, 1935 - September 2, 2018



Patricia was born in Rapid City, South Dakota. In 1955 she married Ronald Weber, and they moved to South Bend where he was finishing his studies at Notre Dame. She worked as a dental assistant in Mishawaka until the birth of the first of three daughters. Subsequently the family moved to Iowa, then to Minnesota, before returning to South Bend in 1963 when her husband joined the Notre Dame faculty. Travel was a part of their lives, and the family lived in Portugal, England and Ireland.

As a longtime member of Little Flower Church in South Bend, Patricia was an advocate for the poor. In addition, she was a volunteer middle-school teacher's aid, a Girl Scout troop leader and a member of an embroidery group that supplied blankets for military veterans. In 2005 she and her husband moved to Valparaiso to be near family.

Patricia is survived by Ronald Weber, her husband of 63 years, her sister Elizabeth Morse, and three daughters Elizabeth Krupcha, Andrea Weber and Kathryn Weber. Also surviving are three grandsons and two great-grandchildren.
