#### IN MEMORIAM

#### Lois G. Berry

October 28, 1932 - March 25, 2019



Lois was born in South Bend, Indiana, to the late Walter and Alice Langford. She lived in South Bend most of her life. In 1955 she married William Berry, and the couple lived in Vetville while Bill completed his Masters in Electrical Engineering at Notre Dame.

Lois earned a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education from Saint Mary's College and a Masters of Education from Indiana University in South Bend. She was a lifelong educator and taught at St. Monica's Grade School in Mishawaka, but primarily at St. Joseph's Grade School in South Bend, where she shared her passion for learning with her many first grade students.

Throughout her life Lois was active in her faith. She and Bill joined the Christian Family Movement, an organization for deepening faith, strengthening families and engaging in social outreach. They continued in this work while Bill taught at Marquette in Milwaukee and then in Lafayette, In., where Bill completed his Ph.D. at Purdue. They returned to South Bend in 1963 and became very involved in the PreCana Program.

Lois is survived by her husband Bill, daughter Elizabeth Berry-Kravis, daughter Suzanne Berry, son Thomas Berry, six grandchildren, two brothers and a sister. Son William J. Berry preceded her in death.
