
We hope you can join us on March 3 for a group visit to Holy Cross House from 2:00-3:00 PM. Holy Cross House is a retirement home for Congregation of the



The topics of the evening were history, empowerment and impact as Susie Farrington, President of The Ladies of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College welcomed members and guests to a new year of friendship and activities at the Opening Reception on Thursday, September 19, 2019

Featured speakers were Douglas K. Marsh, Vice President for Facilities Design and Operations and University Architect at the University of Notre Dame and Cassie Majetic, Associate Professor of Biology and Environmental Studies at Saint Mary's College. Marsh shared an overview of campus changes at ND driven by those he sees as the three great builders of ND: Father Sorin, Knute Rockne, and Father Hesburgh. Majetic shared some history of Saint Mary's as well as current strategic priorities there, including access, affordability, and the impact of academics.

The office of ND President John Jenkins, csc, generously provided the venue and refreshments. Foley's in O'Neill Hall, (Campus Crossroads around Notre Dame Stadium) provided a warm space for members and newcomers to come together and learn of coming events.

Wine Tasting - Citywide Liquors

Many members and guests had the pleasure of tasting five different wines at the new downtown location for Citywide Liquors. Our host, Tim Leyes, described each wine as he poured them. Tim could be Citywides's own "wine guru" as he helped everyone identify the tastes they enjoyed as well as additional wines to try. The Creative Cooking group treated us to delicious appetizers to accompany the wines. If you're looking for an everyday wine or something for a special occasion, stop in to see Tim who would be happy to help you.















Listed below are the wines we sampled with the descriptions and prices.

- Belle Jardin Brut This sparkling wine from France is dry and crisp with hints of Brioche and green apple. A perfect sparkler to pop on a Tuesday evening while sitting by the fire. A great value at \$14.99.
- Scarpetta Pinot Grigio From the Fruili region of northeastern Italy, this crisp wine has a ton of minerality and an intense nose of meyer lemon and kaffir lime. \$17.99 everyday at Citywide Liquors.
- Sean Minor Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir Sean Minor is a fantastic winemaker that buys some of the best grapes in all of California. Ripe cherry flavors are well balanced by a bit of acidity. \$21.99
- Milbrandt Colombia Valley Cabernet Sauvignon
 This easy drinking Washington Cabernet is a great pairing for everything from pizza to filet. \$14.99
- Chateau Bellevue Bordeaux A 2015 classic Cabernet and Merlot blend, this is proper steak wine. Dark cassis and blackberry notes give way to a long smooth finish. \$15.99
