From the Program Chairs...

Program planning this year obviously has been a bit different than in the past. As we started talking about what events might look like, we knew the University of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College situations would impact us, along with the local and national situation regarding Covid-19.

But what really matters, too, are your comfort levels. So thank you to everyone who quickly answered our July Google survey. Your responses and feedback greatly helped shape our planning.

Nearly three-quarters of those who responded reported being comfortable meeting outside (in varying group sizes), and 80% are fine using Zoom. With that in mind, our schedule – for now – centers on opportunities to connect with each other through small-group outdoor activities and virtual events, including one provided by Saint Mary's College.

This year especially, please keep an eye out for LND/SMC Mailchimp emails. Many of the small-group activities – like the BYOBs mentioned below – will be scheduled and announced via Mailchimp. Remember also to check your promotions folder if you use Gmail, since that's often where they go. And with more outdoor activities, we may need to cancel or reschedule at the last minute, so always check ahead if you aren't sure.

Trip to Cobus Creek, an Elkhart County Park Wednesday, September 23, 2020, 10:00 AM

Cobus Creek County Park is located in the northwest corner of Elkhart County. Once farmland, this 84-acre site contains a variety of natural habitats from prairie to woods and wetlands. Cobus Creek is known as a cold-water trout stream, and it runs through the park. The creek's wooded banks and gravel bottom are ideal for supporting trout. A stream restoration project is currently underway to improve trout habitat.

The Sensory Garden is for everyone who wishes to enhance the average garden experience by stimulating the senses. From the first blooms in early spring through the last scent of fragrant herbs in the autumn air, the Sensory Garden is continually graced with the sweet scents, sights, sounds, tastes and textures of nature.

We will walk about 3 miles in the park, maintaining social distancing protocols. Several of our members who know the park well will lead small groups on the trails. We will meet at the picnic area at noon. Bathrooms are available.

Wellfield Botanic Gardens, located in the heart of Elkhart is a 36-acre natural enclave touted as a "living museum" and a working source of hydropower and drinking water. The gardens feature themed botanical spaces and 18 acres of water. The private not-for-profit nature park was created in 2005 to celebrate the inseparable relationship between water and life, inspire creativity and lifelong learning, foster stewardship of our natural world, and grow community. Wellfield is open year-round. Activities include special events and festivals, workshops and educational opportunities, a summer concert series, winter holiday lights, and seasonal programming.

Wellfield's spacious 36 acres, wide pathways, and stunning landscapes are an ideal environment for "social distancing" between families and friends. While the guest entry experience may look and feel a little different than perhaps a previous visit, Wellfield is more gorgeous than ever! After parking, approach the Visitors Cottage. You will be greeted by friendly staff and volunteers wearing face coverings. They will invite you inside. Trip to Boot Lake Nature Preserve, in Elkhart Friday, November 6, 2020

Boot Lake Nature Preserve's sprawling 300 acres encompass wetland, forest, and prairie habitat. A portion of the site has a unique story—having been reclaimed from the City of Elkhart's sludge farm. The transformed site is now a state-dedicated nature preserve protecting Indiana's rare and endangered wetland plants and animals. The preserve is recognized by National Audubon as an Important Bird Area with over 200 species documented, including sensitive grassland-nesting birds found in the 80 acres of restored prairie. Visitors can enjoy a small picnic pavilion, wetland and prairie overlooks, and four miles of trails intertwined with the variety of habitat.
