#### LND/SMC Masking Policy

As many of you are aware, Notre Dame issued new COVID-19 protocols that went into effect January 1, 2022. Since we have previously stated we would be in alignment with Notre Dame's guidance, we will be following the Notre Dame protocols for meetings at Notre Dame as well as for gatherings and events. In effect, until Notre Dame has established that 90% of the campus community has full protection following a booster shot (2 weeks after), everyone must wear a mask inside all Notre Dame buildings unless actively eating or drinking in a dining facility. In addition, no food or drink may be served at an event either on or off campus. (See below for additional details).

In light of this, LND/SMC will be cancelling any event that includes eating or drinking together until Notre Dame has lifted its requirement.

Below is the section from the Notre Dame guidance that was recently emailed to the campus community. *Gatherings and Events* 

Until 90 percent of our community achieves full vaccination with a booster and we are able to eliminate the indoor masking requirement, University-sponsored gatherings on or off campus may not include food or drink, and masks must be worn at all times. #### Yearbook Distribution

In 2020, the Yearbook was distributed electronically for the first time as a way to streamline publication and delivery during a difficult time. A printed version was sent only to those without an email address. Due to the positive response from many members, we decided to offer members a choice of delivery method on the membership registration form. Almost 100 members chose to receive the Yearbook electronically. Prior to publication of the 2021 Yearbook, the board was made aware some members had concerns about the privacy of information in the Yearbook if it is sent electronically. Out of respect for those concerned, the board decided to send a printed edition to everyone this year and have further discussion about the format.

A small group representing board members and those with concerns met in early January. It was decided to continue to offer dues-paying members the choice of receiving a printed copy of the Yearbook or an electronic copy to be sent as a pdf attachment in an email. Members will be able to indicate (or change) their preferred option on each year's registration form. The following statement will be added to the Yearbook: The Yearbook is intended for the sole use of dues paying members of The Ladies of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College. Members may not use the Yearbook for solicitation purposes or disclose the content to anyone outside of the organization.

The 2022 pick for One Book, One Michiana is *Just Mercy* by Bryan Stevenson. The director





In December a group of LND/SMC members received a tour of the Basilica of the

Sacred Heart at the University of Notre Dame. Patti Olive, our tour guide, gave our group a fantastic walk down the history of Fr. Basil Moreau and Fr. Edward Sorin's vision for the University of Notre Dame, the construction and architecture of the Basilica, the Murdy family organ, stories and symbolism of the 116 stained glass windows created by the Carmelite nuns in Le Mans, France, Ivan Meštrović's sculptures not only in-

side the Basilica but throughout campus, Vatican painter Luigi Gregori's intent with the paintings both inside the Basilica and the Main Building as well as the seven side



chapels and history of the Tabernacle including the changes from Vatican I to Vatican II. We concluded our tour with a visit to the museumwhich contains numerous artifacts from the history of the University and the Congregation of Holy Cross.

While we were given a private tour, tour guides are available 7 days a week, nearly 52 weeks of the year. You can stop in anytime and tour on your own, catch a tour guide working at that time for a 5 minute to 1 hour+ tour, or for larger groups, schedule a tour through the Basilica tour coordinator. Depending on the size of your group, they may schedule more than one tour guide. Tours are at no cost.






