As a child, I used to go walking with my Mennonite grandmother. She pointed out and named all the trees, flowers, birds, crops and other observations. Viewing the breathtaking fall foliage in my own backyard as I write this letter is a reminder of the soul-lifting power of nature, something my grandmother never took for granted. Although she has passed, my respect for her grows. Her life was tied to land and nature in an unyielding bond. In fact, I have become certain this bond is genetically programmed into my family.

Since moving to Indiana, my love of nature has continued to flourish. I have learned much through friends, gardening and naturalist studies. Recently published headlines about the collapse in bird populations in the past 50 years reminds me of the sights of the migrating flocks my grandmother used to point out while fall crops were being harvested. I have not witnessed these huge flocks in decades. Unfortunately, it is not just birds who suffer today, but also the insect populations the birds require to survive.


Now, in my 50's, I truly grasp the critical importance of "native" in gardening and landscaping. I am working to make my property

a healthy ecosystem through organic methods, invasive species removal and native plant introductions. As I enjoy my beautifully dressed fall tree display, I do not despair. We have the power to help, and it is simple. Choose to plant native plants, and decline flashy exotic choices at the garden center to adorn the home landscape. Read the book by naturalist Doug Tallamy, *The Nature of Oaks*, and consider planting our most important keystone species.

Out of love for Joyce Kilmer's timeless poem, plant a tree.







In Memoriam

Nancy Lou Fehlner

February 24, 1939 - October 21, 2022



Nancy Lou Clement was born on February 24, 1939 in Brooklyn, New York, the second daughter of John E. Clement and Anna T. Menges. At a young age Nancy moved with her family to Freeport, NY on the south shore of Long Island where she lived until leaving for St. Francis College in Loretto, PA in 1956. She graduated with a B.S. in Chemistry in 1960 and chose Johns Hopkins for graduate school where she held an NIH fellowship and received her M.S. degree. In the mid 1970's, she went back to the University of Notre Dame and earned a M.Th. degree. After a year as a parish religious education director, she joined the faculty of St. Joseph High school where she taught both chemistry and theology courses for 13 years until she retired.

Her favorite story from this time is the one where a group of her science students entered a contest in which the entry was the number of helium atoms in the Goodyear blimp at a certain temperature and altitude, a challenging calculation. The prize was a ride in the blimp in Florida. Their calculation was correct, and they won! A trip to Florida ensued for the students, and their teacher and Nancy got great pleasure in relating to her professor husband how she got to fly the blimp. He was green with envy.

Nancy enjoyed exploring the many varied places all over the world that involved either work or family. Most notably were stays in Benson, UK; Sendai, Japan; Bath, UK and Rennes, France where she had time to meet and interact with some of the local residents.

Nancy died October 21, 2022 in Dujarie House at Holy Cross Village as a result of a stroke. She was 83. Nancy is survived by her husband Tom; her sister Norine in California and brother Jack in North Carolina; son Thom in Sydney, Australia and daughter Anne in Vail, Colorado; three grandchildren, Angela, Nicole and John; and three great grandchildren, Clementine, Deliah and Eloise. She is predeceased by her parents and two children, Peter and Jeanne.

There was a funeral mass on Saturday, October 29 at St. Mary of the Immaculate in Niles, MI.
