Scholarship Recipient Publishes Book about the Titanic

Kelly Skwarkan, one of our current scholarship recipients, is the author of a recently published book *Iron & Ice: The Full Tale of the Titanic*. The 209-page book is available on Amazon in hardcover, paperback and Kindle formats.



Iron & Ice is the product of a decade of research, writing and re-writing which meant Kelly revised and expanded her book every summer between the ages of 11 and 21. Kelly's interest in the Titanic began when she was searching for a topic for an end-of-the-year project at school. An old VHS tape about the Titanic was the catalyst for her project, and a trip to the Titanic Museum in Pigeon Forge, TN, the summer before fifth grade, marked the beginning of her research. She spent two full days at the museum, confidently stating to the museum staff that she was going to write a book.

What distinguishes Kelly's book from all the others? "Iron & Ice bridges the existing gap in the Titanic book market by providing interested adults a middle ground between books written by historians for historians and those written for children," says Kelly. "By weaving together social, psychological, economic, and present-day commentary in character-driven narrative, I illustrate the Titanic's greater significance beyond that of a finite historical event. It is also one of the first (if not the very first) to comment on and connect the eerie parallels between the recent implosion of OceanGate's submersible Titan and the Titanic disaster." The final chapter of the book covers this topic.

Kelly is a graduate of Marian High School and a current senior psychology major at Notre Dame, with minors in health, humanities and society and painting. Outside of class, Kelly teaches barre at the South Bend Beacon Health and Fitness facility and enjoys taking fitness classes of all kinds. After Notre Dame, she intends to pursue a master's degree in sports and performance psychology and a doctorate in counseling psychology.

We will be picking new books at our October meeting. Meanwhile, the list is below.



Pursuant to changes in our by-laws, we are now funding scholarships at Holy Cross College.

Our practice is to forward the funds we have received at the end of each month.

Rosemarie Halloran Keane, 89, of Notre Dame, Indiana, passed away peacefully on Friday, July 7, 2023. Born on June 19, 1934, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, to the late John S. and Ethel (Mattingly) Halloran, she had lived locally since 1989, returning to the Midwest from Washington, DC.

A proud Pittsburgher who could sing the Pennsylvania state song, Rose enjoyed a happy, carefree childhood as the youngest of four children. She graduated from Duquesne University in 1956 with a degree in business education. While at Duquesne, she served as an officer of the Sigma Lambda Phi sorority and vice president of the Pi Omega Pi honorary business fraternity. She was also honored to be selected as the Queen of the University's Military Ball.

After college, Rose went to work at US Steel Corporation where she met John (Jack) Keane. On June 20, 1959, they married in Saint Bernadette's Roman Catholic Church in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. In the last decades of her life, she cheered for the Notre Dame Fighting Irish football team. Rose's greatest joy was being a grandmother to Lindsey, Lauren, and Nicholas. She showered them with love and her Mimi magic.

In her twilight years Rosemarie resided in Holy Cross Village, Notre Dame, Indiana. In relocating from Independent Living to Assisted Care and finally to full time Nursing Care, she always greeted her friends with her beautiful smile. Joy was in her face when you met her on Sunday mornings for the 11:30 AM mass in Our Lady of Holy Cross Chapel, in the Dining Room or visiting around the Village. She is missed by her presence, but not by our memories.
